-Supt. Conklin recommended accepting the proposal submitted by D.S. Meyer Enterprises. Although it is not the lowest bid, he feels it reflects the best strategy for the project.

<u>Village Engineer's Report</u> – Engineer Mancuso (not present) – Written report supplied – read by Mayor Tursi:

- 1. The 4th St. Curb and Sidewalk Project is 95% complete. As of this morning the contractor only had to seal the joint of the curb on 4th Street.
- 2. Allied has commenced investigation to determine the most favorable location for the proposed well. As of today there was one location explored and water was found at approx. 25 feet. They will continue until refusal. A second location will be explored later today or tomorrow dependent upon their progress.

<u>Draft of Local Law for Amendment of Zoning Law & Comprehensive Plan</u> – The RC Dept of Planning GML Review was received today and supplied to the Village Board and Village Attorney. Attorney Rice reported he had forwarded same to the Village Planner, Bonnie Franson. The Hillburn Planning Board's review of the Draft Zoning Local Law is also pending.

Warrant to Rockland County of Unpaid 2022 Village Taxes

The Warrant of Unpaid 2022 Village Taxes at 11/01/2022, including penalty, was sent to the County of Rockland on 11/4/2022. Said Warrant reflected \$71,982.29 due to the Village and consisted of (24) unpaid 2022 Village Tax Bills.
